Everyone enjoys a good story. Youth performers channel this sentiment by bringing traditional fairytales and bespoke narratives to the stage in this modern live theatre event

HE FAUST FESTIVAL 2013 is an opportunity for young actors to perform and share their acting passions and talents with the people of Hong Kong.

The festival has over 60 performances to choose from, performed by children aged from four to 18, A wide selection of performances will be staged, from faithful storytelling of classic children's stories to innovative new shows for adults and family groups alike.





Staging Children's Classics

BUZZ! Buzz! Mosquitos are a nuisance but why do they buzz in our ears? Why Mosquitoes Buzz attempts to answer this very question. Meanwhile, young actors will retell Jonathan Swift's satirical novel Gulliver's Travels, and find out what it would be like if you suddenly became a giant. For older family audiences, the festival will be presenting The Chrysalids. Set many years from now in a post-nuclear holocaust society, a group of young people discover they have an unusual gift of communication.

There are many more classic tales retold in The Faust Festival such as Peter and the Wolf, The Wonderful Hair, Dr Seuss' The Lorax, Madame Skoodle's Poodle, and The Pretentious.

Innovative New Tales

ALONG with the stage adaptations of classic stories, the festival is also showcasing several new tales, many of which have been written especially for the occasion.

Modern Teenage Fables takes a look at traditional fairytales with fresh eyes, re-imagining them in a typical secondary school.

Hollywood Shakespeare investigates what would happen if William Shakespeare was alive and writing right now.

This year's festival also sees the return of the private detective Kip Marlowe as he investigates some strange goings-on in the colourful and often absurd world of a travelling circus in Kip Marlowe and the Stolen Circus.

Other new stories include Fairytale Mash, A Day at the Circus, A Film Noir Fairytale, The King of Contradictions and The Misadventures of the Mask.

Russian tragicomedy

THE CHERRY ORCHARD is a theatrical performance that weaves sorrow with humour, taking the audience on a historical journey back to the 1800s.

Set in 19th century Russia, a woman from an aristocratic family and owner of a cherry orchard travels afar for her lover. Debt collectors wait at the door when she returns home. Left without choice, she sells her orchard and leaves the estate as the axes fall on the

The original play was written by Anton Chekhov, who intended the play to be a comedy, yet the director Constantin Stanislavski took away the farcical elements and interpreted it as a tragedy. The Hong Kong Repertory Theatre will combine both the comic and tragic elements.

Solve the mystery

CSI: THE EXPERIENCE - MACAU is an interactive exhibit where visitors try their hand at solving mysteries. It gives visitors the opportunity to play the role of a crime scene investigator from the US hit TV series. Visitors will familiarise themselves with scientific principles and genuine investigative techniques as they try to solve one of three crime scene scenarios. Visitors will formulate a hypothesis, validate their finds based on scientific evidence and try to crack the case

Participants will learn to take notes, and make observations on fingerprints, blood samples, clothing fibres, DNA samples, bullets and other forensic

evidence. Visitors will have a chance to test for evidence in two highly interactive lab areas and autopsy rooms. In the end, visitors can submit their conclusions and learn whether or not they solved the crime.
